The Bundaberg ICU is a Level 4 ICU as per the Clinical Services Capability Framework which equates to a Level 2 as per the College of Intensive Care Medicine guidelines. It sits on the 1st floor of the Bundaberg Hospital with 8 beds.

The ICU model of care is based on the world wide best practice model of closed ICU with the patient allocation nursing model, as recommended by the College of Intensive Care Medicine (CICM) and the Australian College of Critical Care Nursing (ACCCN) guidelines.

The Bundaberg ICU supports ICU, HDU and CCU patients within the department. There is the capacity to invasively ventilate and provide multi-system support to three critical patients concurrently with three high dependency patients. We have an established relationship with tertiary facilities to support teleconference management/review of selected patients.

The Bundaberg and Coral Coast region is located approximately 400 kilometres north of Brisbane. The area lays claim to the internationally renowned Southern Great Barrier Reef, Mon Repos Turtle Rookery, Bundaberg Rum, and the famous aviator Bert Hinkler.
