By joining the Auckland Region as an Intensive Care Registrar, you enter a programme with rotations through world class teaching hospitals: North Shore, Waitakere, Auckland City, Starship Children's and Middlemore.

The Intensive Care Medicine Training programme in Auckland (Northern Programme) encompasses all the requirements for attaining a Fellowship from the College of Intensive Care Medicine (www.cicm.org.au). It is a five year programme which involves rotations to the following hospitals: Auckland City, Middlemore, North Shore and Starship Hospital. The programme ensures that trainees will gain a broad range of experience in Intensive Care Medicine. The ICUs all have introductory courses on intensive care medicine. (At present there is no formal course for the CICM Part 1 or Part 2 but many Auckland ICM consultants are happy to advise and assist with your study for these exams.) The Northern programme offers all sub-specialities in intensive care medicine such as; Cardiothoracic intensive care, Neuro intensive care, Burns intensive care and Paediatric intensive care.

For those intending to do joint specialisation (e.g. Emergency Medicine and Intensive Care Medicine or Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Medicine), we recommend you only apply for Intensive Care after completing the Part 1 exams for the other specialty. Following this you liaise with the Auckland Intensive Care Medicine vocational training committee with regards to organising your Intensive Care Medicine training and how this will fit in with completing training in your other specialty.

Eligibility Criteria

- Ideally a history of completing a six month run in one Intensive Care Unit (very preferable)
- For NZ/Australian graduates to be a PGY3.
- For UK graduates to be a PGY3 – Postgraduate year 3 at minimum.
- Eligible for registration with the Medical Council of New Zealand.
- If dual training, have commenced training in the other specialty
