NWRH is a 160 bed acute care facility, employing 780 staff, located on the North West coast of Tasmania. NWRH is fully accredited by the Australian Council on Healthcare Standards (ACHS), and is also an accredited teaching hospital with the University of Tasmania Rural Clinical School.

The NWRH ICU is led by an Intensivist who is a Fellow of the College of Intensive Care Medicine (CICM) and clinical care is provided by fully qualified Intensivists who are fellows of the CICM with a 24/7 on-call cover arrangement. The unit is accredited by College of Intensive Care Medicine (CICM) for Basic, Foundation and Rural training in Intensive Care Medicine, and is approved to train CICM candidates under Commonwealth-funded IRTP and TMSDT programs. This is a great opportunity for suitable trainees to fulfil Fellowship requirements including the anaesthetics component, on a rotational scheme in Tasmania.
