Senior Resident Medical Officer's in Acute Care Medicine

The Department of Critical Care Medicine (DCCM) at the Royal Hobart Hospital, in conjunction with the Department of Anaesthesia and Perioperative Medicine and the Department of Emergency Medicine, offers Senior Resident Medical Officer positions as follows:

Senior Resident Medical Officer – ICU/Anaesthetics- six months Anaesthetics and six months Intensive Care as SRMO during the one year tenure.

Senior Resident Medical Officer – ICU/ED- six months Emergency Medicine Registrar and six months Intensive Care as SRMO during the one year tenure.

These positions are highly sought after.

Since their inception in 2015 they have provided a pathway into registrar training positions in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Medicine for many trainees.

In ICU, SRMOs work day and night shifts of 13 hour duration, usually 6-7 shifts per fortnight. SRMOs are supported after hours by ICU registrars working the same shifts and on-call Senior registrars and Specialists.

In Anaesthetics, SRMOs work under the direct supervision of a Specialist Anaesthetist. The work pattern is office hours then participation in the after-hours roster when ready.

In Emergency Medicine, the Registrar will work under the supervision of Consultant Emergency Physicians. This will be shift work.

Candidates can state their term preference; however the allocation of terms will be determined by the three departments and is non-negotiable.

The ICU/Anaesthetics and ICU/ED SRMO term will align with the RMO term dates, starting 13 January 2020.

What we are looking for

- General or limited registration with the Medical Board of Australia
- A minimum of two years full time equivalent postgraduate experience in Australia or New Zealand
- Nb. Candidates who have previously held an Acute Care SRMO position at the RHH are ineligible to reapply for the same position the following year. They can apply for a different SRMO position; or consider applying for a registrar position.
- Previous experience in Anaesthetics, Emergency Medicine or Intensive Care Medicine would be desirable
- Completed acute care training courses such as, but not limited to, ALS, BASIC, APLS, EMST
- Career Interest in an acute care specialty or remote and rural medicine
