This post is accredited for training by the College of Intensive Care Medicine for 6 months of core ICU training, foundation training and rural exposure requirement. It is also accredited by the colleges of emergency medicine, general medicine, and rural hospital medicine training.

Whangarei is the largest hospital in Northland, providing secondary care services for the region, supported by three regional hospitals. Northland covers an area of 12,600 square kilometres and has a population of approximately 170,000. Trainees from other specialties, depending on availability, may be offered three months in anaesthesia during their 12 month appointment. As a Intensive care registrar, you will also work as a member of the northland helicopter retrieval service which offers exciting and challenging experience. There is an active clinical training programme and regular quality assurance meetings.
